Course objectives:

Students shall gain the knowledge on elementary legal institutes of European Justice Cooperation in civil matters. Procedural remedies such as small claims procedure and European payment order shall also form an integral part of the course. Basic information on EU crossborder insolvency rules shall be provided as well.
